Bureau of Indian Education Vocational Education Grant Program Policy

Introduction:

The Bureau of Indian Education's (BIE) Vocational Education Grant Program is not an entitlement program. You do not automatically receive funding because you are an American Indian. That is why it is very important for you to become familiar with the requirements of the BIE's grant program college admission requirements as well as your tribe's eligibility terms and the relationship between these various programs and offices. Your full attention is needed to successfully complete admission and financial packages.

Purpose:

The purpose of the BIE's Vocational Education Grant Program is to provide <u>onetime</u> supplemental financial assistance to the eligible American Indian/Alaska Native student seeking a Vocational Degree.

Eligibility:

A student must comply with the following eligibility criteria and submit a complete application.

1. Tribal Membership

<u>Must</u> be a member of the Hopland Tribe which is eligible for the special programs and services provided by the United States through the Bureau of Indian Education because of their status as Indians. Students must submit Tribal ID # or a photocopy of their Tribal ID Card.

2. Admission to Nationally Accredited Institution

<u>Must</u> be accepted for admission to a nationally accredited institution of vocational education. Student must provide their college acceptance letter and/or a copy of their current class schedule.

3. Financial Need through FAFSA Award

<u>Must</u> demonstrate financial need as determined by the financial aid officer of the college institution. This is done through the FAFSA application process. An award letter must be provided stating that you will be receiving state or federal assistance (including eligibility for Federal Subsidized Loans) for the semester/year you are attending college. Finally, a letter explaining your financial needs must also be submitted with this application (any supporting documents should be attached).

4. Satisfactory Grades

In order to reapply for the BIE Higher Education and/or Vocational Education Grant you must show proof of passing the prior semester of courses with no "F" grades. Failing a course may result in denial of future BIE Higher Education Grant requests.



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Step 1:

- Applications are requested from the Education Department
- <u>All substantiating materials should be submitted with the application</u> to the Education Department Director
 - 1. Enrollment Verification
 - 2. Class Schedule
 - 3. Prior Semester Grades
 - 4. Tribal Identification
 - 5. Financial Needs (FAFSA Award)

Step 2:

- File is received in Tribal Administration
- Tribal Administration will verify substantiating documents with Education Director
- With Approval, file and check request will be forwarded onto the Fiscal Department

Step 3:

- File is received at Fiscal Department
- Discussion with Education or Tribal Administration will be held for any additional comments (if necessary).
- Check is approved
- Check is issued and sent to student or directly to university/college
- Fiscal Department shall keep a log of all distributions

Step 4:

• Student will be monitored by quarter/semester while attending school. This is done through student transcripts or official semester/quarter grade report. Failure of student to provide requested paperwork may result in delayed or denial of current and future supplemental education support.

Note: If you are found to be financially ineligible to receive grant scholarship funds after completing the application process, yet you meet all the the other requirements, you may be eligible for a tribally funded scholarship if funds are available.
